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KEITH E. WHITTINGTON is William Nelson Cromwell Professor of Politics at Princeton University. He is the author, most recently, of *Speak Freely: Why Universities Must Defend Free Speech*. His other books include *Political Foundations of Judicial Supremacy: The Presidency, the Supreme Court, and Constitutional Leadership in U.S. History*, which won the C. Herman Pritchett Award for best book in law and courts and the J. David Greenstone Award for best book in politics and history, and the co-authored casebook, *American Constitutionalism*, which won an award for innovative instructional materials in law and courts. He received a B.A. and B.B.A. from the University of Texas and a M.A. and Ph.D. from Yale University.

NICHOLAS QUINN ROSENKRANZ is a professor of law at Georgetown University and a senior fellow in Constitutional Studies at the Cato Institute. Before joining the faculty at Georgetown, he served as an attorney-advisor in the Office of Legal Counsel of the U.S. Department of Justice, and he clerked for Judge Frank H. Easterbrook on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit and for Justice Anthony M. Kennedy at the U.S. Supreme Court. He is currently developing a new theory of constitutional interpretation and judicial review. The first installment, *The Subjects of the Constitution*, was published in the *Stanford Law Review* in 2010, and it is one of the most downloaded articles about constitutional interpretation in the history of SSRN. The second installment, *The Objects of the Constitution*, was also published in the *Stanford Law Review*. And the comprehensive version is forthcoming as a book by Oxford University Press. Professor Rosenkranz serves on the Boards of Directors of both the Federalist Society and the Foundation for Individual Rights in Education, and he is one of the founders of Heterodox Academy. He holds a B.A. and J.D. from Yale University.
