He is a former member of the President's Council of Bioethics and the Board of Scientific Counselors of the National Center for Health Statistics. Mr. Eberstadt has written extensively on issues in demography, development, and international security, and is author or editor of some 20 books and monographs, ranging from *Poverty in China* (1979) to *A Nation of Takers: America's Entitlement Epidemic* (2012). In 2012 he was awarded the Bradley Prize. Mr. Eberstadt earned his AB, MPA and Ph.D. at Harvard and his M.Sc. at the London School of Economics.
